A One-Day Workshop titled “Methods and Techniques in Geographic Research” was organized by the Department of Geography, Bhattadev University, on 29th May 2025. The event was held at the Department of Geography, and it aimed to equip participants with essential research techniques and methods applicable in geographical studies.



The workshop was inaugurated by **Professor Manjit Das**, Registrar, Bhattadev University, who highlighted the significance of methodological rigor in geographic research. The session provided an in-depth understanding of the socio-ecological aspects of rural communities in Assam.



Session–III : “Biodiversity Degradation and Conservation Issues in North East India

- **Resource Person: Professor Dhrubajyoti Saharia**
Participants learned about the challenges to biodiversity and the need for conservation strategies in the North East region.



Session-IV : “Searching of Research Gap in Geospatial Platform: An Understanding”

- **Resource Person: Dr. Pankaj Roy**
The focus was on identifying research gaps and leveraging geospatial tools to address them.



Session-V : “Parametric Hypothesis Testing Methods: t and F Test”

- **Resource Person: Dr. Dipak Baruah**
This session covered the application of parametric testing methods in geographic data analysis.
